Central New Mexico Electric Cooperative Celebrates Local Heroes in the Fourth Annual #WhoPowersYou Contest

Central New Mexico Electric Cooperative, in partnership with Touchstone Energy Cooperatives, is pleased to announce the fourth annual #WhoPowersYou Contest, celebrating local heroes. It's a chance for CNMEC members and employees to nominate someone making a difference in our community and an opportunity to celebrate the power of human connections. In addition to being nationally recognized, nominees can win up to \$5,000 for the cause they champion.

To nominate a local hero in our community, members and employees can go to whopowersyou.com and submit their nominee's name, photo and a brief description of how they make a difference in our community. Nominations open on August 5 and must be submitted by midnight on September 6. Only members of Touchstone Energy Cooperatives, including those in Central New Mexico Electric Cooperative, are eligible to nominate.

Winners will be announced in October. An independent panel of judges will select winners based upon the positive impact they make on the community, creativity of the entry and the number of votes they receive.

Prize money totaling \$9,000 will be awarded to the following winners:

• Grand Prize Winner: \$5,000

• Second Place: \$2,000

• Third Place: \$1,500

• Honorable Mention: \$500
